Floor Schedule and Procedure

- **Suspension Bills:** Today, the House will consider several bills on the Suspension calendar. Bills considered on the Suspension calendar are debatable for 40 minutes; may not be amended; and require a two-thirds vote for passage. If a recorded vote is requested, it will be postponed.
 1. **H.R. 1275** - Utah Recreational Land Exchange Act of 2009 (Rep. Matheson - Natural Resources)
 2. **H.R. 1129** - To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide an annual grant to facilitate an iron working training program for Native Americans (Rep. Lynch - Natural Resources)
 3. **H.R. 1945** - Tule River Tribe Water Development Act (Rep. Nunes - Natural Resources)
 4. **H.Con.Res. 142** - Supporting National Men's Health Week (Rep. Cummings - Oversight and Government Reform)
 5. **H.Con.Res. 127** - Recognizing the significance of National Caribbean-American Heritage Month (Rep. Lee (CA) - Oversight and Government Reform)
 6. **H.Con.Res. 135** - Directing the Architect of the Capitol to place a marker in Emancipation Hall in the Capitol Visitor Center which acknowledges the role that slave labor played in the construction of the United States Capitol (Rep. Lewis (GA) - House Administration)
 7. **H.Con.Res. 131** - Directing the Architect of the Capitol to engrave the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and the National Motto of "In God We Trust" in the Capitol Visitor Center (Rep. Lungren - House Administration)

8. **H.R. ___** - To authorize the Director of the United States Patent and Trademark Office to use funds made available under the Trademark Act of 1946 for patent operations in order to avoid furloughs and reductions-in-force (Rep. Conyers - Judiciary)
